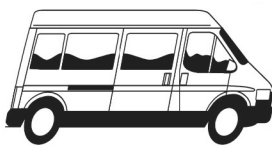

Members present: Mike Jacobson, Mike Schaefer, Eric Perleberg, Mary Kay Price, Todd Allmaras, Patti Larson and Travis Benson. Others present: Dr. Jill Louters, Superintendent; Avolt Baumbach, Secondary Principal, Natalie Becker, Elementary Principal. Dave Skogen, Business Manager.

President Jacobson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Approval of the Agenda
 It was moved by Price and seconded by Larson to approve the addition of Item G District Tuition Agreement and Open Enrollment Application. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Consent Agenda
 It was moved by Larson and seconded by Price to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Motion carried unanimously. The consent agenda consisted of the minutes from the October 10th regular meeting, the November 8th special meeting, the business manager report, and the bills - general fund of \$48,573.66 the activity fund of \$9,901.55, and the food service fund of \$20,492.43.

Monthly Committee Reports
 Board Member Larson spoke regarding the Building Committee meeting that was just held.

Discussion regarding the air handler and an OCR review with and work associated with it was the primary discussion. Board Member Allmaras spoke regarding the Second Gym committee meetings that had been held. Discussion towards fundraising efforts has been the primary focus of the recent meetings.

Principals' Reports

Elementary Principal Becker presented her report to the board. Principal Becker will be leading the Region three Principals meeting later this week in Devils Lake. Work with the elementary leadership team continues as a recent elementary assembly was held. Project Ignite Light was a success as 31 pairs of pajamas and \$431 were donated.

Secondary Principal Baumbach presented his report to the board. MTSS training was recently held in Bismarck for several staff. New corrective reading data is showing student growth. Attendance academy was held on October 20th, and Building Tomorrow's Leaders met on October 26th and 27th to conduct an activity with Donna Anderson of NDSU Extension.

Superintendent Report
 Superintendent Louters shared her report with the board. Work continues on the second gym project. Consultation with members, reference checking on professional fundraisers, and contin-

ued consultation with the North Dakota Foundation have and will continue through the coming weeks.

Dr. Louters will be presenting nationally this month as part of the AASA Steering Committee. The committee is a rural education cohort focused on leadership in rural school districts. Lastly, a review of STARS achievement data specifically in ELA and math.

Teacher Report
 Dean of Students Tasha Skogen, and Student Engagement Specialist Tyler Cook gave a presentation to the board on Choice Ready. A video was presented on what Choice Ready is and how districts and colleges across the state are using the information to prepare their students for life after high school.

NR-S recently applied for a \$20,000 Choice Ready grant which could be used for dual credit class tuition for students. Sophomores recently were able to attend the North Valley Tech Expo in Grand Forks. Freshmen will be able to experience a similar event in December. Mrs. Skogen and Mr. Cook went through the different career "clusters" in choice ready and how students are actually able to try them on a "plan of life" allowing them to explore all options. In closing, it was discussed how job shadows have now expanded from just seniors to all high school students. Twenty-one students have completed a job shadow this year with another fourteen to complete one in November.

Student Report

Junior Keaton Cudworth, representing the football team, gave the board an update on the recently completed football season. A new offense and a young team grew in confidence until injuries were too much to overcome. Playoff appearance for the team, which also featured four all conference and 2 honorable mention all-conference players. Next year Maddock will join the program for football only.

Close Up Trip
 It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Benson to approve out of state travel for the trip.

Motion carried unanimously. Close up advisor and secondary teacher Matt Shaffer presented to the board on the plan for the trip. Cost of the trip is \$2,005 per student and would be taken in early June. Fund raising will start soon, and as of now 9-10 students plan to go. Trip would also require Matt as a chaperone, with a female chaperone preferred as well.

Second Gym Project - Board of Directors Reappointment

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Price to nominate Dennis Nybo, David Bymoan, and Board Members Mike Jacobson, Travis Benson, and Eric Perleberg to the Foundation Board of Directors. Motion carried unanimously.

Foundation board consists of two community members and three board members. They will serve as an instrument of the board relating to the funds held in the foundation account.

Superintendent Evaluation

It was moved by Benson and seconded by Price to approve the formative evaluation of Superintendent Louters as Satisfactory. Roll call vote unanimous, motion carried with seven yes votes. Board members completed their own individual evaluation of Superintendent Louters using an online format from Rocky Mountain Evaluations. Each area of evaluation was scored on a 1-4 basis. Each section was reviewed, and a roll call vote was made for each section. Each section presented carried a satisfactory score. A roll call vote was held for each section to approve the score calculated; approval of each section was unanimous. Roll call votes as follows, Area A. Goal and Vision Setting: Area A rated as satisfactory with seven S votes. Area B. Board Relations:

Roll call vote unanimous, Area B rated as satisfactory with seven S votes. C. Human Resource Management: Roll call vote unanimous, Area C rated as satisfactory with seven S votes. D. Curriculum and Student Support Services: Roll call vote unanimous, Area D rated as satisfactory with seven S votes. Area E. Community Relations: Roll call vote unanimous, Area E rated as satisfactory with seven S votes. Area F. Operations and Resources Management: Roll call vote unanimous, Area F rated as satisfactory with seven S votes.

Policy KAAA Revision

It was moved by Price and seconded by Allmaras to approve the first and final reading of policy KAAA Revision. Motion carried unanimously. Only change to the policy was a clarification defining via the century code, school property, which is more comprehensive than just the school building.

Policy KAAA-AR Revision

It was moved by Price and seconded by Benson to approve the first and final reading of policy KAAA-AR Revision. Motion carried unanimously. Revision of the policy features more expansive and detailed description of the policy and provides more clarity and guidance which helps avoid miscommunication and confrontation in the front office.

Policy ACF - First Read

No motion was made tonight as item was tabled until the December meeting. Policy ACF was read and discussed but more time was requested by the board prior to deciding on the new policy.

Open Enrollment and District Tuition Agreement

It was moved by Price and seconded by Benson to approve the Open Enrollment and District Tu-

ition Agreement applications for two students. Motion carried by majority vote. Motion approves enrollment for two sixth grade students, with transportation provided by the district.

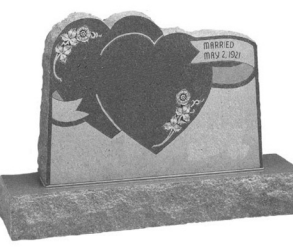

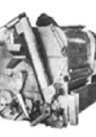

President Richter called the meeting to order at 8:00 am in City Hall with Commissioner Belquist (via phone), Commissioner Hewitt, and Commissioner McKnight present. Commissioner Ystaas absent.

The Commission was given copies of the complaint letters. Richter requested that the Auditor reply to Janzen in a letter addressing her complaints as discussed in the special meeting.

The Auditor presented different options for CD's to the Commission. The options were discussed, but no motion was made on the given options. The

discussion was tabled, as additional information was requested from Auditor.

McKnight made a motion to remove George Ritzke, Devon M. Allmaras, Amy Ellingson and Calvin Packard from the Community Credit Certificate and to add Becki Schumacher. Hewitt seconded. All were in favor. Motion carried.
