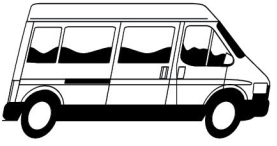

Public Notice

New Rockford-Sheyenne Public School District No. 2 Regular School Board Meeting Monday, December 12th, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

Members present: Mike Jacobson, Eric Perleberg, Todd Allmaras, Patti Larson and Travis Benson. Others present: Dr. Jill Louters, Superintendent; Avolt Baumbach, Secondary Principal, Natalie Becker, Elementary Principal. Dave Skogen, Business Manager.

President Jacobson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Approval of the Agenda

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Benson to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the November 14th 2022 Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Benson and seconded by Larson to approve the minutes of the November 14th 2022 meeting as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Consent Agenda

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Perleberg to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. The consent agenda consisted of the business manager report, and the bills - general fund of \$30,488.80 the activity fund of \$3,420.22, and the food service fund of \$10,660.03.

Monthly Committee Reports

Board Member Allmaras spoke to the recent Second Gym Committee meeting. The Committee met with Pace Fundraising, discussing the fund-raising needs for the project and what their service could do to reach that goal.

Principals' Reports

Elementary Principal Becker presented her report to the board. Parent Teacher Conferences were held on the 22nd with a 98 percent attendance. The Seasons of Giving service project is nearing completion, with one donation already in and another to be in after Friday. Elementary Christmas Program will be on the 15th, with two programs.

Secondary Principal Baumbach presented his report to the board. Graduation Requirement Committee met two times in the past month to prepare a capstone rubric and recommendations for the School Board in February. Students have shown

excitement in the capstone project. Dual credit options for students continue to be explored, with two options/schools at the forefront.

Principals Becker and Baumbach jointly presented to the Board, recent data collected from their MTSS work. The goal of MTSS is to catch students up on two years of growth in one year, with the motto "as fast as you can, as slow as you must". Data was reviewed showing the process is working, with growth across the board some already exceeding the goal set, and some well on their way to meeting the goal.

Superintendent Report

Superintendent Louters shared her report with the board. Work continued this month with scheduling of transportation, driver education, and personnel matters. Second Gym Committee meetings continue to explore fundraising opportunities, as well as continued consultation with ICON. Work is underway to revise the Emergency Planning Manual. At a recent early out, staff were able to meet with Sheriff Lies to go refresh on what to do in the event of an imminent threat. In closing Dr. Louters noted that insulation work has been completed on the Boiler project resulting in reduced temperatures in and around the boiler room, and due to staffing and student interest the proposed Close-Up trip for this summer has been pushed to next summer.

Teacher Report

Elementary teacher Kendall Christianson was present this evening. She updated the Board on the happenings in the elementary side of the school. The holidays are upon us, and fun activities have been planned. A door decorating contest involving the kids will be held, as well as dress up days for the last week of school before break.

Student Report

Seniors Kyria Dockter, Madison Myhre, and Junior Kelsie Belquist, representing the volleyball team, gave the board a recap of their season. After a slow start to the season, they noted their confidence started to grow, and they truly wanted what was best for each other. The season concluded with

the schools first trip to the State Volleyball Tournament. The tournament was described as an awesome experience both on and off the court, with many memories made.

Pre-K Conference - Nashville

It was moved by Allmaras and seconded by Perleberg to approve out of state travel for the trip. Motion carried unanimously. Pre-school teacher Lori Demester spoke to the board about the national conference. The conference, titled Elevate, pertains to learning to lift each other up, both students, co-workers, and yourself in the school setting. Estimated total cost of the trip is \$1,500 and will be covered by the Behavioral Health Grant.

Collegiate Edu-Nation Partnership

Dr. Louters presented on a partnership of schools in west Texas focused on rural resiliency. Due to location and economy, west Texas faces many of the same educational and economic challenges as we do here in North Dakota. The intent of their partnership is to invest in their own, and "upskill" rural workers. To accomplish this, they focus on being intentional in engaging students, and expanding online learning opportunities. NDSU has expressed interest in partnering with NR-S as part of a pilot program.

Bus Barn Project

Discussion was held on the Bus Barn project. Previous discussions with the bus barn have been to put up a building to house district transportation with funds currently in the building fund. That plan would include a building not insulated at this time due to costs and budget. With the boiler project complete and the flat roof replacement this past summer, one option suggested would be to find a program that would allow the district to borrow funds against future building fund revenue. This plan would not change the current mills allocated; it would simply designate revenue the district would already be receiving specifically for this payment annually. More work is to be done to find the best program or option that gives the district the best possible use of their current and future funds.
