Class B cross country meets in North Dakota are typically divided into a junior high division, a girls' varsity division and a boys' varsity division.

Junior high kids would run a 3K (1.8 miles), and varsity girls and boys would run a 5K (3.1 miles).

Each runner would be competing to finish the best they can for individual placement, but they'd also compete as a team, with each scoring a certain number of points depending on their finishing position.

The season will conclude at the state meet in Jamestown on Friday, Oct. 25.

The American Academy of Sleep Medicine recommends that preschoolers ages 3-5 get 10 to 13 hours of sleep a night. 
