Hunting dogs

I love dogs. Someone doesn't have to spend much time around me to realize that not only am I a dog person as opposed to a cat person, but I simply enjoy being around dogs. I've appreciated just about every dog I've ever met. I prefer big, furry hunting dogs, but little dogs are amusing to me also. A few years ago, I had a 50 lb coonhound/terrier cross named Ed. He looked quite a bit like a skinny Labrador retriever, but relates to people completely differently. I found this out when I was training him as a puppy.

See, Ed proved to be difficult to train because while he looks like a stupidly-faithful Lab, he isn't. Labrador retrievers live and die to earn their master's approval. You can break the spirit of a good, hunting Lab with a look or by withholding the all-im-

portant "good boy." Ed, on the other hand, doesn't die for my approval. Because of his coonhound father he has his own agenda which doesn't include a passionate drive to make me happy and earn my approval. For him, fetch is about the pursuit of the ball, not returning it to me and getting the pat on the head.

Now, as I thought about this difficulty in our relationship, I came to a startling realization. When hunters talk about "good" or "bad" hunting dogs, or "smart" versus "dumb" hunting dogs, they aren't talking about brain power - no, they're talking about obedience and a desire to obey. An intelligent dog wouldn't jump into freezing water to fetch a duck, only to immediately give it away. No, only a very obedient dog would do that. These are the desirable dogs - dogs that completely put themselves aside to

please their master. Ed isn't this way. Coonhounds have been bred to work largely without humans. They need to think, make decisions and outsmart their prey with little or no human interaction or help. Because of this, we had to work out new training methods with quite a bit of frustration.

It was during one of our regularly frustrating training sessions that the other side of my realization hit me: is this how I am with God? Am I a Lab who faithfully follows everything Jesus tells me to do? Am I willing to put my life on the line to please my master? Or am I a lot more like Ed than I want to admit? Honestly, I believe that I'm a lot like my dog that so often frustrated me. I doubt God's commands. When I feel the Spirit leading me, I question, I wonder, and I say to myself "is this what you really want?" I read and I preach things from the Bible and I

have to fight my nature, because my nature tells me to soften his commands. My nature is to make the words and truths of Jesus easier to swallow. Even when I do good things, more often than not I do it because I seek the joy I get from it, not the pleasure it gives God.

While the world may call a questioning soul a good thing, in hunting dogs and God followers, it's not very helpful. When we choose to follow Jesus, we are supposed to drop everything and follow him, including our fierce independence. We should pursue Jesus without doubt and without a second thought - not unlike an approval-driven Lab. When our master asks us to do difficult, seemingly impossible things, we shouldn't doubt or think, we should run as fast as we can and jump as far as possible out into the frozen water, trusting that our master knows what's best.

Although antique and classic cars have always been a part of the daily afternoon parade at 2 p.m., a Classic Car Show has been added to the schedule. Owners are encouraged to bring all makes and models prior to 1975. Lifetime member Terry Gortmaker, who has been a member of the Bridge City Cruisers in the Valley City area, is chairing the event this year.

Friday evening an indoor dance in the Potter Pavilion will be held from 8 p.m. to midnight featuring the band Silverado of Fargo. Silverado plays the best of current and classic country along with some rock and roll.

Silverado is not your daddy's country band. They are guaranteed to move attendees out of their seats to get their boots on the dance floor. Silverado has opened for national acts such as the late Toby Keith, Sara Evans, The Beach Boys, Montgomery Gentry, Mark Chesnut, Tracy Lawrence and Joe Diffie.

Hanson's Bar will be providing the beer garden, open at 7 p.m. Admission to the dance is free with the purchase of a \$20 wristband good for admission all three days of the reunion. The dance is open to the public with the beer gardens limited to those 21 years of age and older.

Over the past few years, several activities for kids have been added to the lineup. The annual Kids Pedal Pull event

has a new start time - 10 a.m. for registration with the pull beginning at 11 a.m. on Saturday morning. All kids ages 4 through 11 are welcome to participate. Kids of all ages can also drive tractors from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. daily during the reunion. This event is popular with the many area students who attend as a school field trip on Friday. Members donate their tractors and offer to ride along with each kid.

The 19th annual tractor trek is set for Thursday, Sept. 19. The group, which includes many New Rockford area tractor owners, will leave the show grounds at 9:45 a.m. and arriving in Fessenden for lunch. Refreshments will be served for the trek participants beginning at 9 a.m. John Lee of Carrington has chaired this event for several years, mapping a gravel road route with great scenery of the local countryside.

Close to 40 spaces have been rented for the craft and vendor sale again this year. Vendors with a wide variety of goods for sale are coming from towns throughout North Dakota, as well as Surprise, Ariz. and Fisher, Minn.

The youngest vendor will be 10-year-old Spencer Phelps, the owner of Spencer's Sweet Stop Candy Shop, in Colfax, N.D. At the age of 8, this young entrepreneur told his grandma selling lemonade in front of the post office in Ambrose, N.D. was just not cutting it and he needed to move onto something bigger and better. His booth features lots of old fashioned candy,

including salt water taffy he has shipped in from Utah.

Daytime musical entertainment this year will be provided by The Euphoria Band at noon and 3 p.m. on Saturday, and Mylo Hatzenbuehler is back by popular demand, performing at noon Sunday.

Monkey Balls is a new food vendor at the reunion, offering a unique product described as marrying a funnel cake with a donut - and the offspring would be the monkey balls. They are a deep fried dough served with cinnamon butter or powdered sugar.

All of the food vendors returning provide show attendees with a wide variety of popular foods to try.

Admission to the Central N.D. Steam Threshers Reunion for youth ages 11-17 is \$5 daily or \$10 for the weekend. Kids age 10 and under are still free. Adult admission is \$10 daily or \$20 for a weekend wristband. More information and a complete schedule of events can be found at centralndsteamthreshersreunion.com.

"During the commission meeting on May 6th, 2024 the original email that was sent by Michael Beaver on April 10th, 2024 to the NDHP, was provided showing that Michael Beaver had actually requested NDHP assistance in Cooperstown specifically for the community event," states court documents.

"The email had been al-

tered by Michael Beaver to change the request from Cooperstown to Griggs County. Michael Beaver admitted to altering the record during the commission meeting."

The original email also shows that Beaver redacted a portion showing that he requested more than just one trooper from the NDHP, contradicting what he told commissioners.

Beaver submitted his resignation as Griggs County Sheriff later that day, and court documents further state that Beaver admitted to investigators that he altered the email.

Beaver was subsequently charged on Friday, Sept. 6 for tampering with public records, a Class C Felony with a maximum penalty of five years' imprisonment and/or a \$5,000 fine. A warrant was issued for his arrest.

That same day he also resigned from the Wells County Sheriff's Office, where he had been hired as Chief Deputy following his resignation from the Griggs County Sheriff's Office.

Beaver was previously an Eddy County deputy from late October 2014 to mid-August 2017.

At his first court appearance on Monday, Sept. 9, Beaver was released on a personal recognizance bond. His next court appearance will be a preliminary hearing scheduled for 1:15 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 22 in Griggs County court.

Beaver is considered innocent unless proven guilty.

Richter made a motion to approve the August bills. Fleming seconded the motion. In a roll call vote, Richter, Belquist, Fleming, and Dauenhauer voted "aye". No nay votes. Motion carried.

The Commission agreed and requested the Auditors Office and Public Works Department to prepare a protocol to use.

Public Works Superintendent Hirschert presented his report. Interstate Engineering came and looked at the gravel road on 14th St and reported that the road is compacted to the appropriate levels. A filter cell at Water Plant was not bubbling, which has now been fixed. Waste Management has been hitting buildings, fences, etc. with their trucks, working with them to submit to insurance.

City Auditor Presnell presented his report. The USDA Civil Rights Compliance Review was completed. The Dutch Elm Disease tree letters were sent out. Presnell had a meeting with a representative with the ND Floodplain

OLD BUSINESS:

The status of nuisance vehicles and yards were reviewed. The City Hall remodel project was discussed. Request for bids will be going out in the newspaper for the roof.

The Substandard Building discussed at the August meeting was reviewed. The certified letter came back, Presnell will be bringing it to the Sheriff's Office to serve.

Peterson and Presnell will work on the lease agreement for the city office rental.

NEW BUSINESS:

Richter made a motion to approve a local gaming permit for New Rockford Eagles Auxiliary, and the NR-S Close Up. Dauenhauer seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Fleming asked the status of the repairs to the bathroom roof. PWS Hirschert reported a quote was obtained and Hirschert will tell the contractor to get it on the schedule to fix.
